**WESTERN WAKE FREEWAY CONSTRUCTION WILL CLOSE PORTION OF
GREEN LEVEL CHURCH ROAD BEGINNING MONDAY**

Work on project continues to progress

RALEIGH – Contractors for the Western Wake Freeway project will close a section of Green Level Church Road between Kelly Road and Creekside Landing Drive in Apex beginning Monday, Aug. 29. The closure is needed to construct a new roadway that will tie into Jenks Road and is expected to be in place until early October. A posted detour will route traffic onto Roberts Road and the open portions of Green Level Church Road.

In addition, crews continued concrete paving this week from Roberts Road to Green Level West Road, and nighttime paving work along this stretch is still ongoing.

Work progressed this week as crews:

- Continued to grade between Green Level Church Road and Jenks Road, as well as south of U.S. 1, south of Old Holly Springs Apex Road and north of Olive Chapel Road;
- Continued to install a storm drain pipe between U.S. 64 and Olive Chapel Road, as well as utility pipes south of U.S. 1;
- Continue hauling dirt from south of U.S. 64 to Olive Chapel Road, as well as from south of U.S. 1;
- Prepared the road bed for paving north and south of U.S. 1; and
- Continued bridge work at Carpenter Fire Station Road, Jenks Road, Beaver Creek, Beaver Creek Commons, the CSX railroad crossing and U.S. 1.

Next week crews are scheduled to:

- Continue concrete paving from Roberts Road to Green Level West Road;
- Continue to grade between Green Level Church Road and Jenks Road;
- Prepare the road bed for paving at U.S. 1;
- Continued to install a storm drain pipe between U.S. 64 and Olive Chapel Road, as well as utility pipes south of U.S. 1;
- Continue bridge work at Carpenter Fire Station Road, Jenks Road, Beaver Creek Commons, the CSX railroad crossing and U.S. 1; and
- Continue hauling dirt from south of U.S. 64 to Olive Chapel Road.

North Carolina's first modern toll road, the Triangle Expressway in Wake and Durham counties, is an 18.8-mile toll road system. This new roadway runs from the N.C. 55 Bypass near Holly Springs to I-40 at N.C. 147 and is comprised of three projects: the Western Wake Freeway, the Triangle Parkway, and a portion of existing N.C. 540 between N.C. 55 and N.C. 54.

NCDOT reminds motorists to watch signs for construction information, stay alert and obey the posted speed limit.
